	Essential Duties & Responsibilities for Charge Nurse
1	Assumes responsibility for self and others to ensure that documentation is accurate and concise monitors the nursing patient care activities and the patient responses to nursing interventions.
2	Monitors the nursing patient care activities and the patient responses to nursing interventions.
3	Documents ongoing assessments, within a timely manner as determined by policy, accurately reflecting any overt physiological and psychosocial needs of patients.
4	Develops and implements a patient care plan that is current and reflects individual needs or preferences of patients.
5	Reviews staff documentation at the end of shift to insure completeness and accuracy.
6	Performs 24-hour chart checks.
7	Insures diagnostic requests are routed appropriately
8	Makes patient – staff assignments based on staff competency to care for specific patient care needs.
9	Monitor nursing interdepartmental patient care needs and delegate assignments and/or tasks to all available nursing department staff as needed to cover patient care needs.
10	Monitor and respond to census changes by evaluating staffing plan/matrix and make adjustments to staffing based on staffing matrix and acuity of care required.

1	Working knowledge of patient monitoring equipment in Special Care Unit.
2	Working knowledge of drug protocols for Special Care Unit.
3	Maintain equipment and supplies readiness at all times.
4	Print and interpret ECG strips every shift and prn.
5	Ability to care for patient on ventilation support.
6	Ability to care for patient with arterial line.
7	Ability to care for patients undergoing cardioversion.
